

New colors for STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP in 2010 with rider Randy Krummenacher and newcomer Quentin Jacquet

After three seasons represented the colors of DeGraaf Technisch Personeel and Exact Software in the MotoGP World Championship, STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP presented today in Switzerland the new red color of the STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP team.

The unveiling of the new 2010 colors of STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP was performed by special guests. STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP was proudly to introduce Scuderia Toro Rosso Formula 1 driver Sebastien Buemi, Miss Switzerland 2006 Christa Rigozzi and the 81-year 3-times World Champion 125cc Luigi Taveri.

STIPA "Wohnen bewegt" of Switzerland is the new main sponsor of STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP. STIPA specializes in selling your land, planning your project, the realization of your plans or managing your property. In 2010 STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP compete again in the 125cc MotoGP championship with Switzerland's Randy Krummenacher and the French 'Rookie' Quentin Jacquet..

The 20-year-old Swiss Randy Krummenacher will for the second successive year represents the colors of the Dutch STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP. In 2009 we didn't reached the expected results with the factory Aprilia RSA but in 2010 Randy Krummenacher is eager to finish every Grand Prix in the top 5.

STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP now has one year of experience with the Aprilia RSA and in 2010 the team can use the benefits of this experience. 2009 was a tough year because all the data of the Aprilia RSW wasn't really useful for the factory Aprilia RSA. Chief engineer Hans Spaan has worked hard this winter to improve the Aprilia RSA even more for this season and believes in a podium finish in some of the races this season for Randy Krummenacher.

Newcomer to the team is the 19-year-old Frenchman Quentin Jacquet. Quentin Jacquet is not an entirely unknown in the MotoGP world. The Frenchman has some wild cards in 2009 and manages to finish, with an injured shoulder, close to the world championship points. After an 8-year career in the French Championship BMX bicycle racing with 59 wins, 87 podiums and 16(!) National and regional championships titles, the Frenchman thought it was time in 2006 to make a step in his career and moved on motorized two-wheelers. In 2008 Quentin Jacquet took part in the prestigious Red Bull Rookies Cup and continued his career in 2009 in the IDM German and Spanish Open Championship. The Frenchman feels ready to participate in the 2010 125cc MotoGP championship and will consider it as learning year.

Randy Krummenacher (Age 20):

"After a difficult year in 2009 on the Aprilia RSA I'm confident that this year the performance will be better. Especially the last race on the beautiful Spanish circuit of Valencia, where I fought for the 4th position, has pushed me to fight every race this year for a top 5 position! During the winter I worked hard on my fitness and I have trained over the winter. It like it to be part again of the STIPA Molenaar Racing GP team and with the collected data in 2009 of the Aprilia RSA, 2010 will be a great year! I know I have an ambitious goal to compete with the top of the world but I will use the coming tests to prepare myself for the season. On April 11th during the first Grand Prix in Qatar I will be ready and fight for a top result!"

Quentin Jacquet (Age 19):

"I am very grateful to the STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP team which gave me the chance to compete on the top-level of motorcycle racing. For every rider it is a dream to compete in the MotoGP World Championship. It will not be easy as a 'Rookie' struggle to deal with the best riders in the world. I will use his season as a learning year and try to reach the highest possible results. The team has a lot of experience and certainly will my team-mate Randy Krummenacher help me out this season and I will approve every race. My goal is obviously to catch some points, although this will be very hard! I'm already looking forward to my home Grand Prix in Le Mans. Hopefully I can score my first MotoGP point during this weekend. I'm looking forward to the start of the season and will do my best and will use the experience of the STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP team to improve step by step. "

Arie Molenaar (Team Owner STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP):

"Of course it is great that we have an International GP Team with the base in The Netherlands. After all the years of experience we build up, I really think we will have this year a good chance to fight with the top of the 125cc MotoGP Championship. For the second successive season we have the Swiss rider Randy Krummenacher. He is a world-class rider and will fight with the best riders of the world. This season Randy's teammate will be the 'Rookie' Frenchman Quentin Jacque. Quentin has made his mark in the BMX bicycle racing and was absolutely the best in its class. After Quetin was chosen for the Red Bull Rookies Cup in 2008, Quetin managed to achieve good results in the hardest competition Europe the German IDM Championship and the Spanish Open. This year will be a learning year for the young Frenchman, but I am confident that he will have some good results. 2010 will be a great year with massive results! "

Jarno Janssen (Team Manager STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP):

"I am very pleased that we have a great team again this year with great riders! We started the season in 2009 with the hopes of some top 5 results but by the lack of experience with the factory Aprilia RSA we didn't reached this goals. In 2010 we have experience and data of the Aprilia RSA and with our rider Randy Krummenacher we will fight for the top 5 results. I am convinced that Randy will compete several times with the top of the 125cc MotoGP Championship. Our newcomer Quentin Jacquet will learn a lot this season. Still I think he can give the team some good races and will claim some World Championship points. I am convinced that 2010 will be a great year and the expected objectives will be reached! "
