

Randy Krummenacher (8e) fights to an eighth place in Jerez

Good race for Quentin Jacquet (21e)

Again it was a thrilling 125cc race during the Gran Premio bwin De España. The fight was on for every inch and STIPA-Molenaar Racing GP rider Randy Krummenacher competed with seven competitors to the fifth position and eventually claimed eighth position. Jacquet Quentin started the race from 28th position and managed to climb to a very nice 21st place.

With a good start Swiss rider Randy Krummenacher had immediately the connection with the second group that was fighting that time for the sixth position. Krummenacher maintained at the eighth position in the early stages. Halfway through the race the group was joined by Jasper Iwema , Danny Webb and Johan Zarco. The group consisted of seven riders at that time fighting for seventh place. After the failure of a mechanical problem of Sandro Cortese and a crash out of Efen Vazquez, the fight was on for the fifth spot. Krummenacher kept his head cool and tried to score as many points as possible. After a nice sixth position in Qatar the Swiss rider performed very well again and scored a very good eighth position.

Quentin Jacquet had a good start and climbed from a 28th starting position to a 26th position. Jacquet was able to connect directly to a group fighting for the 20th position with six other riders. The whole race was they were switched positions and was not shunned contact between the riders. The Frenchman did well and brought his Aprilia RSA as 21st on the finish line.

Randy Krummenacher (8th):

"This was a tough race. I had a good start and was able to start from my 10th to the 8th place in the first turn. It was very difficult to connect to the leading group. The battle began immediately and there was a lot of passing in the group. This makes it difficult to get a rhythm and ride fast lap times. After several laps it was clear that the leaders cannot be retrieved, and I focused to get the lead of the second group. Danny Webb crashed just in front of me in the last two laps and I lost the connection to the sixth position. An eighth position is good. I know I can go along with the leaders but the season is still long. I look forward to the next race at Le Mans."

Quentin Jacquet (21st):

"I'm happy with this 21st spot. My start was good and could directly connect to the group fighting for the 20th spot. The whole race it was hectic and we passed each other several times. You notice that these drivers have more experience, especially when they overtake each other. I had a good pace and passed two more riders in the last few laps. A 21st position is great. Things are getting better and I learn to ride the Aprilia ever better. The next race is my home race at Le Mans. In this weekend I hope make another step forward and perhaps finish the race into the top 20."
